





STRATEGIC PLAN 2017 – 2021

In December 2016, the Queensland Government announced the release of the Queensland Sexual Health Strategy 2016-2021 and the Queensland HIV Action Plan 2016-2021.

In June 2017, a Sexual Health Ministerial Advisory Committee was established to provide expert advice required to achieve delivery of these comprehensive strategies. This Committee will also provide HIV policy advice, previously provided by the HIV Foundation Queensland (HIVFQ).

The procurement of services previously undertaken by HIVFQ will be transferred to the Department of Health. The service agreement between the Department and HIVFQ has not been renewed and concluded on 30 June 2017.
